ORDINANCE 25-07

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MANDEVILLE TO AMEND SECTION 10-38(b) OF THE MANDEVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE FOR ONE WAY TRAFFIC ON A CERTAIN SECTION OF JEFFERSON STREET AT CERTAIN TIMES.

WHEREAS, Mandeville Code of Ordinances Section 10-38 grants the Mayor and City Council the power to designate streets or portions of streets for one-way traffic only in accordance with Louisiana Revised Statute 32:78(B); and

WHEREAS, it has been requested of the City to place a "Do Not Enter", "7:00-8:00AM and 1:30-2:30pm" on Jefferson St. between Carroll St. and Lafitte St during carline hours for Our Lady of the Lake School to help reduce traffic congestion and enhance overall traffic flow in the vicinity of the school; and

WHEREAS, during the times listed, the sign will allow one way traffic to flow east from Carroll St to Lafitte St. on Jefferson St.; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Mandeville, that there be added to the Mandeville Code of Ordinances Section 10-38.13 to read as follows:

13. Jefferson Street between Carroll Street and Lafitte Street be one way in an easterly direction from the hours of 7:00 to 8:00am and 1:30 to 2:30pm on school days.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, all other portions of Section 10-38 (b) remain in effect with no changes.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the City Council of the City of Mandeville hereby adopts and amends the provisions of this ordinance to be effective upon the Mayor's signature.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Mandeville Police Department be authorized and empowered to create, install, and maintain necessary and proper signage in furtherance of this Ordinance;







ORDINANCE NO. 25-04

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MANDEVILLE REGULATING THE OPERATION OF ANY MOTORIZED CONVEYANCE ON SIDEWALKS WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS, AND PROVIDING FOR RELATED MATTERS.

WHEREAS, the City of Mandeville recognizes the need to ensure public safety and pedestrian accessibility on sidewalks;

WHEREAS, the operation of any motorized conveyances on sidewalks poses potential hazards to pedestrians and property;

WHEREAS, the City seeks to balance the needs of various modes of transportation with the safety and comfort of pedestrians;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the City Council of the City of Mandeville, hereby creates and implements Section 13-17 Motorized Conveyances on Sidewalks in the Mandeville Code of Ordinances to read as follows:

1. Definitions. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the following definitions apply: (a) "Motorized Conveyance" means a conveyance propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular power (for example, electric, gas, battery) (b) "Sidewalk" means that portion of a street or roadway set aside for the exclusive use of pedestrians.

2. Prohibited Use of Sidewalks. (a) No person over the age of ten (10) years shall operate a motorized conveyance on sidewalks within the City of Mandeville. (b) Children aged ten (10) years or younger may operate motorized conveyances under 5mph on sidewalks, provided they do so in a safe manner that does not endanger or impede pedestrians. (c) In business districts or commercial zones, the operation of motorized conveyances on sidewalks is prohibited unless explicitly allowed by signage.

3. Exceptions. (a) This prohibition does not apply to mobility devices used by individuals with disabilities. (b) Law enforcement officers may operate motorized conveyances on sidewalks in the course of their official duties when necessary for public safety. (c) City workers or contractors hired by the City or authorized to do work by the City on the streets or sidewalks may operate motorized conveyances on sidewalks when necessary.

4. Enforcement and Penalties. (a) Any person found to be in violation of this Ordinance shall be subject to a warning for the first offense. (b) Subsequent offenses may result in fines not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) per violation.

5. Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof is held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared severable.

BE IT ORDAINED that this ordinance shall be effective following the Mayor's signature; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Clerk of this Council be and is hereby authorized and empowered to take any and all actions which she, in the exercise of her discretion, deems necessary to promulgate the provisions of this ordinance.

- 2. Set forth the following actions necessary to maintain permit requirements contained in the Louisiana Water Discharge Permit System (LPDES) number <u>LA0038288</u>.
 - a. Continue to provide certified operators for collection and operation by providing 16 hours of training per operator over the next year. This training will be conducted through off-site classes and with the assistance of CES, Inc.
 - b. The City will continue to video and smoke test to identify I&I problem areas.
 - c. Investigate City non-domestic user Ordinance during 2024, consider conducting a nondomestic user survey to identify system users.
 - d. The City will continue to work with its environmental consultant to increase monitoring of Ponds and maintain both wetland discharges as per the LPDES Permit project.
 - e. Monitor wetland discharges and ensure proper wetland loadings for permit compliance.
 - f. Continue maintenance to maintain rock-reed filtration efficiency.
 - g. Continue to supply and consider additional aeration to ensure proper influent treatment and proper biological reduction.
 - h. The City will ensure proper operation of the treatment system through on-going testing, monitoring influents and using the EQ Basin when necessary.
 - i. Continue to monitor and rehab all areas identified as "problem areas" of the collection system and investigate potential solutions to rainfall events causing collection system overflows.
 - j. Continue to upgrade collection system lift stations and investigate methods of minimizing power outages.

- k. Comply with DEQ Lab certification requirements, QA/QC monitoring procedures and new electronic data submission requirements and
- 1. Investigate and implement alternative means of disinfection for discharge from wastewater treatment facility.







- 1. Reviewed the Municipal Water Pollution Prevention Environmental Audit Report which is attached to this resolution.

  - e. Monitor wetland discharges and ensure proper wetland loadings for permit compliance.
  - f. Continue maintenance to maintain rock-reed filtration efficiency.
  - g. Continue to supply and consider additional aeration to ensure proper influent treatment and proper biological reduction.
  - h. The City will ensure proper operation of the treatment system through on-going testing, monitoring influents and using the EQ Basin when necessary.

# AMENDMENT NO. 4 TO THE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF MANDEVILLE AND

#### **NEEL-SCHAFFER, INC.**

#### MANDEVILLE LAKEFRONT WETLANDS RESETORATION PROJECT

THIS FOURTH AMENDMENT (the "Amendment") is entered into by and between the City of Mandeville, represented by Clay Madden, Mayor (the "City"), and Neel-Schaffer, Inc., represented by William D. Lancaster, P.E., Agent/Officer (the "Consultant"). The City and the Consultant are sometimes referred to as the "Parties". This Amendment is effective as of the date of execution by the City (the "Effective Date").

#### **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, the City and the Consultant are parties to a professional services agreement dated on April 14, 2021 (the "Agreement") to update plans and specifications and perform bidding, construction administration, and inspection services to restore the wetlands at the Galvez Outfall and construct a pedestrian path between Lakeshore Drive and Sunset Point Park as specified by the Department of Public Works;

WHEREAS, in response to the City's request, the Consultant submitted a supplemental proposal dated June 29, 2021 (the "Consultant's Proposal), and the City accepted the Consultant's Proposal, to provide additional topographical survey and basic design services for the Lakefront Wetlands Restoration Project (the "Project") to extend the planned bike path on the top surface of the berm from the western seawall on Lakeshore Drive to the nearest multi-use/pedestrian path (approximately 1000') and to add lighting to the path from Sunset Point to Lakeshore Drive), and the City accepted the Consultant's Proposal; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 1 with an execution date of August 20, 2021 amended the original Agreement for the Consultant to perform additional topographical survey and basic design services associated with a change in project scope to extend the planned pathway on the top surface of the berm from the western seawall on Lakeshore Drive to the nearest multi-use/pedestrian path (approximately 1000') and to add lighting to the path from Sunset Point to Lakeshore Drive; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 1 further modified the Consultant's fee schedule and increased the maximum aggregate payable amount by the City to provide the aforementioned additional

professional services from \$333,904.00 to the revised not to exceed amount of \$369,391.00 based on the Consultant's letter proposal dated June 29. 2021;

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 2 with an execution date of January 12, 2023 amended the Agreement for the Consultant to revise the project's contract documents (plans and specifications) for the removal of the pathway along Lakeshore Drive and the pathway and associated lighting on the berm with no adjustment in Consultant's professional services fee; and

**WHEREAS,** the Original Agreement had a duration of (2) years from the Effective Date of April 14, 2021, that was then extended by Amendment No. 2 for (1) additional year from the original contract expiration date of April 14, 2023, to a new expiration date of April 14, 2024; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 3 with an execution date of May 13, 2024 amended the Consultants original contract expiration date one (1) additional year from April 14, 2024 to April 14, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Consultant now desire to further amend the Agreement to add additional professional services for the Lakefront Wetlands Restoration Project and to adjust compensation accordingly;

NOW THEREFORE, the City and the Consultant amend the Agreement as follows:

- A. <u>SERVICES</u>: The Consultant's Scope of Work and associated professional services are being amended as follows based on the direction received from the City for the Lakefront Wetlands Restoration Project:
  - 1. Changing the berm structure elevation from average +8.5 NAVD88 to +6.0 NAVD88 (Construct to +7.5 NAVD88 estimating 1.5 feet of settlement).
  - 2. Deleting the bridge at Sunset Point Park and along Lakeshore Drive
  - 3. Updating the geotechnical settlement and slope stability for the berm structure.
  - 4. Modeling the reconfigured project to ensure the revised design does not impact flood elevations and updating the June 2019 modeling report to reflect new results and exhibits.
  - 5. Revising and updating permit documents for agency approval.
  - 6. Preparing and presenting the revised Plans and Specifications for approval to the City of Mandeville Planning and Zoning commission as well as approval of the City Council.
  - 7. Reducing Resident Inspection (RI) to reflect the revised design. The RI

budget is now based on 510 hours of inspection at \$100 per hour.

- 8. Assist City in Application for CPRA's Parish Matching Program for FY2025 RFP.
- 9. Reduction in the material testing budget from \$20,000 to \$10,000 to reflect the removal of the bridge and pathway on the berm.
- 10. Inclusion of the following bid alternates:
- a. Base Bid Earthen berm with rip rap protection. No restrictions on trucking or barging.
- **b.** Alternate No. 1 Channel Excavation & Marsh creation on both sides of the channel.

## B. <u>COMPENSATION</u>:

1. *Fees Added for Lakefront Wetlands Restoration Project*. The following professional design services and other supplemental services fees are being adjusted in accordance with the Consultant's proposal dated <u>February 24, 2025</u>:
