The City of Mandeville's Parks and Parkways Commission is pleased to announce their Hurricane Ida Tree Street Planting Program for residents within the Mandeville city limits for Fall 2021, Winter 2022 and Spring 2022. (if you pay a water bill to the City of Mandeville you are within the city limits). This is an initiative under the Mandeville Parks and Parkway's Commission Re-leaf Program which has been planting trees and giving away seedlings since 2005 in an effort to restore Mandeville's canopy...

Reasons to Plant and Care for Trees in Mandeville

Trees provide shade and cool our homes during our summer months!

Trees intercept storm water runoff and mitigate impacts from flooding!

Trees add value to our properties!

Trees produce oxygen through photosynthesis!

Trees buffer noise pollution!

Trees provide food and homes for wildlife and birds!

Tree roots hold soil in place and prevent erosion!

Trees are beautiful!

Rules To Participate

- 1) The Re-leaf program is at no cost to the resident;
- 2) The trees will be planted by the City with an Agreement by the Resident to provide After-Care. All trees will be high quality trees from local nurseries;
- 3) Residents may request up to four trees. Two of the four are to be planted in the front yard, the two remaining trees provided may be planted by the resident elsewhere on the property, as long as there is adequate space for growth.
- 4) Our goal is to plant the public space in front of the house and provide trees to be planted elsewhere on the property;
- 5) Choose which of the 3 Planting Cycles would prefer FALL 2021, WINTER 2022 or SPRING 2022. Then choose your selection of trees.

- ❖ Water once a week with a slow drip for 10 minutes during the months of May to October for the first two years, taper off as tree establishes itself
- ❖ Maintain a proper mulched area around the tree roots
- ❖ Prevent trunk damage from weed-eaters and lawn mowers
